In reply to your letter dated 27 November 2017 on the role of (official) veterinarians in meat inspection, I would like to confirm that the Commission does not intend to introduce substantial changes in the methodology of ante- and post mortem inspection. Such inspections must remain independent and always the responsibility of the official veterinarian as clearly indicated in Regulation (EU) 2017/625 of the European Parliament and of the Council¹.

The European Parliament and the Council fixed in that Regulation to which extent slaughterhouse staff can be involved in meat inspections² (Article 18(3)) and the Commission is not enabled to provide derogations or implementing provisions on this issue.

The European Parliament and the Council did oblige the Commission to lay down a delegated act allowing official auxiliaries (which are part of the competent authorities) to carry out certain

inspection tasks, under strict conditions and subject to comprehensive training requirements³. Your concerns, which I fully share, will be taken into account in such delegated act.

I recently had a meeting with the Federation of European Veterinarians (FVE) to better understand the concerns of veterinarians and to assure them of my intention to maintain the spirit of the Regulation (EU) 2017/625 including the central role of the official veterinarian.
